1. Welcome

Martin Maticka (AEMO) opened the meeting at 1:30 pm (AWST) and welcomed attendees to the second WA Gas Consultative Forum (WAGCF) meeting of 2018.

All GSOO related actions from the previous meeting (30 January 2018) had been completed. No further comments were raised and the minutes were endorsed. AEMO to publish the minutes from the previous meeting as final on the website (action item 1.1).

2.1 Proposal to Decrease Participant Submission Time and GBB Data Publication

Amanda Niklaus (AEMO) presented on a proposal to decrease the time between individual submission times and GBB data publication.

Participants have asked for an opportunity to decrease the submission data time and the time which AEMO make the information available. AEMO conducted a review of participant submission deadlines for the data and the times that AEMO is required to make the information public. The findings showed that GBB participants that have the obligation to provide the information, provide it in advance. AEMO welcomes any feedback, reassessment of the process and can put forward a rule change if required (action item 2.1.1).

2.2 GSI Rule Change Proposal

Amanda Niklaus (AEMO) also presented on overview of the Rule Change Proposal to move the GBB Zones from the GSI Rules to a GSI Procedure.

3. Data Centre migration

Michael Pawle (AEMO) provided an update on the data centre migration from Belmont to Brisbane.

Seventy percent of the movement of non-critical systems from Belmont to Malaga has been completed with production systems from Belmont to Brisbane and shutdown of Belmont site schedule for completion by end of June.

4. 5 yearly GSOO review, preliminary results

Neetika Kapani and Noelle Leonard (AEMO) presented an update on the five-yearly WA GSOO review process. In accordance with the GSI Rules, AEMO must undertake a review of the WA GSOO every five years since its inception, which falls in 2018. AEMO has taken on board feedback from stakeholders attending the last WAGCF in January concerning the review structure. The Terms of Reference and submission template were developed and circulated to gas stakeholders and analysis of the information received is currently underway. A final report will be published in July 2018. Procurement activities will commence in July 2018 for the 2018 WA GSOO, scheduled for publication in December. AEMO requests any additional feedback on the review to be provided to AEMO by no later than 5 June 2018.

5. Formal information request – 2018 WA GSOO, preliminary results

Noelle Leonard (AEMO) provided an overview on preliminary data from the formal information request (FIR) process conducted for the development of the 2018 WA GSOO. AEMO had a 100% response rate to the FIR. AEMO thanked gas Market and non-GSI Participants for submissions.

6. Future Agenda items

Adam Welch from APPEA suggested that AEMO present how aspects of the WA Electricity Statement of Opportunities (ESOO) fed into the WA GSOO methodology.

Taron Bearley from Department of Jobs, Tourism, Science and Innovation offered to present an update on the implementation of the WA Domestic Gas Supply Policy at the Q3 2018 WAGCF.

7. Other business

There were no other items that were raised under “Other business”. Martin Maticka summarised the action items from the WAGCF and reminded attendees that they could provide feedback and/or comments through the various standard communication channels in place.

8. Next meeting

Martin Maticka thanked stakeholders for their attendance and closed the meeting at 2.40 pm. The next meeting is scheduled for 4 September 2018.
