1 Welcome and previous meeting minutes

Martin Maticka (AEMO) opened the meeting at 10:02am, welcomed attendees to WAGCF No. 21.

2 Gas supply disruption/ Emergency Management Facility (EMF) event

Damian Mugridge (AEMO) provided some background on AEMO's role in GSI rule, the registered participant types and explained the role of EMF, before presenting an overview on the EMF activation event that took place on 5 January 2023 to 8 January 2023.

Stakeholder Questions:

Vivek Karia (JTSI): Why wasn't the EMF activated for the John Brookes outage?

AEMO: The John Brookes / Varanus Island outage did not result in line pack on the DBNGP to reach Amber status. The Coordinator of Energy is responsible for activation of the GBB (WA) EMF.

Richard Cheng (ERA): Was Yara paid compensation to turn down during the EMF?

AEMO: The CoE is in the process of conduction a review into the event. AEMO cannot comment on any specific compensation arrangements which may apply. Further questions can be directed to Tim Bray who is conducting the review on behalf of the CoE.

3 Energy Policy WA: DBNGP – Amber Alert Incident review update

Tim Bray (EPWA) provided an update on DBNGP – amber Alert incident review, noting; A Terms of Reference is now live and EPWA are looking into understanding the causes and effects of these events, in terms of the stability of the natural gas pipeline. Particularly the effectiveness of the supply and demand mechanisms of the gas market during the situation and the processes and mechanisms used by government, industry and stakeholders more broadly to help manage the situation. The intent of the review is to examine and report on the engagement with industry, both in the lead up, during and post the incident, with a particular focus on confirming what worked well and what needs improvement. EPWA has begun the process of starting to work with stakeholders with a series of sessions in the pipeline. All views from across the sector will be consolidated to form a fact-based report. The goal is to have this report to the Coordinator of Energy within six weeks.

Stakeholder Questions:

Vivek Karia (JTSI): Why wasn't the EMF activated for the John Brookes outage?

AEMO: The John Brookes / Varanus Island outage did not result in line pack on the DBNGP to reach Amber status. The Coordinator of Energy is responsible for activation of the GBB (WA) EMF.

4 2022 WA Gas Statement of Opportunities (GSOO)

Christopher Meredith (AEMO) presented the highlights from the 2022 WA GSOO that was published mid December 2022, discussing the key findings, gas demand – forecast methodology and forecasts, potential gas supply – inputs and forecasts and adjusted supply-demand balance.

Stakeholder Questions:

Roger Farinha (Kleenheat): The 63% of storage that was full, what was the breakdown of this from TGS to MSF and how can participants see this data on GBB?

AEMO: In October 2022, when the storage gas was calculated, the split was 24% in Mondarra and 76% in Tubridgi.
