AEMO Competition Law Meeting Protocol



AEMO is committed to complying with all applicable laws, including the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (CCA). In any dealings with AEMO regarding proposed reforms or other initiatives, all participants agree to adhere to the CCA at all times and to comply with this Protocol. Participants must arrange for their representatives to be briefed on competition law risks and obligations.

Participants in AEMO discussions must:

- 1. Ensure that discussions are limited to the matters contemplated by the agenda for the discussion
- 2. Make independent and unilateral decisions about their commercial positions and approach in relation to the matters under discussion with AEMO
- 3. Immediately and clearly raise an objection with AEMO or the Chair of the meeting if a matter is discussed that the participant is concerned may give rise to competition law risks or a breach of this Protocol

Participants in AEMO meetings **must not** discuss or agree on the following topics:

- 1. Which customers they will supply or market to
- 2. The price or other terms at which Participants will supply
- 3. Bids or tenders, including the nature of a bid that a Participant intends to make or whether the Participant will participate in the bid
- 4. Which suppliers Participants will acquire from (or the price or other terms on which they acquire goods or services)
- 5. Refusing to supply a person or company access to any products, services or inputs they require

Under no circumstances must Participants share Competitively Sensitive Information. Competitively Sensitive Information means confidential information relating to a Participant which if disclosed to a competitor could affect its current or future commercial strategies, such as pricing information, customer terms and conditions, supply terms and conditions, sales, marketing or procurement strategies, product development margins, costs, capacity or production planning.

5MS update – Rule change proposal

- The 5MS Program is **on track for commencement on 1 October** and participants should progress their compliance and readiness programs on this basis
- Given the complexity of the 5MS program, risks exist, and issues could arise that could ultimately impact the commencement date of 1 October 2021
- To mitigate the impact of such an event arising, AEMO has developed a contingency plan in consultation with the 5MS industry Program Consultative Forum, which includes submitting a *precautionary* rule change to allow for alternative commencement dates.
- AEMC commenced the four-week consultation period for this precautionary rule change request on 5 August.
- AEMO will publish a 5MS start notice on 1 September which will provide a go/no-go status against 1 October using the market readiness essential capability that has been developed in consultation with the 5MS working groups.

5MS update – rule change proposal (cont.)

- If market readiness essential capability has not been met, AEMO will advise of the issue causing this status, the length of time needed to remediate the issue and the suggested alternative date.
- If a "go" status is provide, 5MS will commence on 1 October 2021 as planned.
- If a short delay is needed, the suggested alternative date will be 1 December 2021 – WDR will consequently move to 1 December 2021, as well as Customer Switching and Electricity B2B
- If an extended delay is needed, AEMO has provided two alternative dates for consideration:
 - 1 February 2022 the soonest date after the change freeze period from mid-December to end of January
 - 1 April 2022 to align with a quarter start and avoid summer operations
 - If an extended delay is required, the AEMC will consider which date is appropriate
 - AEMC will publish their final determination on the 30 September 2021.

WDR Update

- WDR Activities remain on track for
 - o Preproduction deployment from 27 September
 - o Industry test from 4 October
 - o Go live 24 October
- 5MS Staging Environment has been rebuilt for WDR System Integration Testing (SIT)
- The following functionality is in or being moved into the SIT environment:
 - o Settlements & prudentials
 - o System Operations
 - o Operations Forecasting
 - o Bidding & Dispatch
 - o Baselines
 - o Retail system (including PAE and eMDM updates)
 - o Portfolio management system (phase 2)

Stakeholder update

- AEMO is yet to receive any applications for registration as a DRSP
- Discussions with several prospective participants are ongoing and an expectation that registration applications will be received in August
- DNSPs have received requests for aggregation endorsement
- It is anticipated that the external facing functionality of the Portfolio management system will be available for preproduction although this delivery remains at 'amber'
- DNSP reporting:
 - The DNSP report will not contain embedded network information (unless a NMI is part of an aggregation that includes DNSP NMIs).
 - It is not a straightforward matter to elucidate parent-child relationships from the retail database. This work has been descoped due to the delivery timelines and cost of implementation.



Industry testing

Industry testing (1/2)

- AEMO recognises the importance of industry testing to allow participants to test the new data model, reporting and any customisation they have implemented
- WDR programme is aiming to be in preprod by Mon 27 Sep 2021
- Timing is based on assumptions:
 - o WDR cannot do code drops into pre-prod during 5MS market trial
 - o Risk that 5MS market trial will run late
 - o WDR SIT E2E UAT needs to be substantially completed
- Aiming to commence industry testing Mon 4 Oct 2021



Industry testing (2/2)

- Due to truncated timelines, the limited number of DRSPs likely to be in pre-prod and confidentiality considerations, the **test strategy** is being updated.
- Primary target is prospective DRSPs, FRMPs and DNSPs:
 - o Allow testing of data model changes and new reports
- DRSPs in process of registration will also be able to access and exercise all functionality.
 With exception of external facing PMS which may not be available until 24 October.
- DRSPs will have ongoing access to pre-prod to test out their bidding capabilities post go live.



Test strategy

AEMO is proposing to:

- Set up a dummy AEMO DRSP in preprod
- Establish multiple DUIDs in RMC
- Aggregate multiple NMIs to each WDRU/DUID in PMS to ensure a cross section of FRMPs and DNSPs
- Provide information on the NMI:DUID mapping ahead of time to the relevant FRMP / DNSPs
- Provide an indicative timeframe of the planned dispatch events, and update as required
- Create several WDR dispatch events in the first week of industry test
- Run a preliminary settlement in the second week of industry test to capture the main processes
- Liaise directly with at least one DRSP, FRMP and DNSP to ensure data is delivered and reported as expected
- Prospective DRSPs may undertake their own industry testing at any time, e.g. schedule dispatch events as they require

DISCUSSION: What else will be useful to test in pre-prod ahead of 24 Oct 21 go-live, noting timeframes will be limited?

Industry Testing: Next steps

- Updated test strategy will be published for review by 31st of July with a view to publishing a final version by 15th of August
- FRMPs and DNSPs taking part in industry test to be identified by 30th of August
- Test data sets and Test workbook to be developed and distributed by mid-September
 - WDR will follow the same framework as 5MS and use the Test Workbook to record details about the scenarios and data. Hence a separate Test Plan will not be required.
- AEMO to update the industry through the WDR CG on timelines for industry test planning
- AEMO to review how best to manage demands of industry test and potential remediation work in pre-production

- Actual delivery of reports is targeted to be available on Sept. 27 as part of WDR Pre-Prod roll-out.






